# The Living Word

Second Sunday of Advent

5th December, 2020

#### **First Reading**

Is 40:1-5. 9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah *Prepare the way for the Lord.* 

'Console my people, console them' says your God.

'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.'

A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'

Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem.

Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.'

Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him.

The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him.

He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms,

holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

#### **Second Reading**

2 Pt 3:8-14

A reading from the second letter of St Peter

We wait for new heavens and a new earth

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

#### Gospel

Mk 1:1-8

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

#### Make straight the paths of the Lord.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way.

A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight, and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'



#### Gospel Focus - Preparing the Way

The gospel passage quotes the prophet Isaiah (although text combines Malachi 3:1; Isaiah 40:3; and Exodus 23:20) and casts John the Baptist in the role of fulfilling the prophecy of the voice that cries in the wilderness, 'Prepare a way for the Lord'. The description of John in camel-skin and eating locusts and wild honey is designed to align him with Elijah, the great prophet of Jewish history. In a very short and sharp passage the gospel ties the coming of Jesus to the expectation of a messiah that has run through Jewish history and been foretold by the great prophets.

#### **REFLECTION** by Fr Michael Tate **Two Gospels**

John immersed, baptised, his followers in water, symbolising the washing away of the sins of the past. But he could



not empower people by drenching them in the dynamic life of God. anticipates John 'Someone' (not named!) who does have the power to inundate, baptise, people with the Holy Spirit.

From the heading of St Mark's Gospel, we know that that 'Someone' is 'Jesus Christ, Son of God' who came to flood our lives with that Divine Pow- \* er which can effect a completely new future for humanity.

That is why St Mark took the term 'gospel' (good news) which was used on inscriptions announcing an Emperor's birth or victory, and used it to describe his inspired render- \* ing of the mission of Jesus Christ, which was to inaugurate the 'Kingdom of God', overcoming the pretensions of all Emperors of any kind throughout history.

We could pause for a moment to thank God for the Good Questions for Adults News of our being baptised with water in the 'Name of the \* Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.'

#### **REFLECTION** by Dianne Bergant CSA

In the wilderness God's salvation comes to a broken people. In the midst of what is seemingly an impossible situation, hope emerges with vigour. In this context, hope is an openness to surprise, the surprise that God is in no way limited to the imaginings of human minds and the consequences of human history. This is the kind of hope that is proclaimed in the wilderness by John; it is the kind of hope that trusts that from the impossible, God can work a new creation.

There is something of a time warp in Christianity. What is future is made present. The prophetic oracle announces the future as if it is already happening. This sense of the future-present prompts new ways of living. As the future takes root in human lives, the present is transformed into \* a new creation and the Day of the Lord appears.

God's future comes through the wilderness into the bro- \* ken city and inspires a broken-hearted people. The con- \* trite heart is a broken heart, an emptied-out heart, a hope -filled heart. It is a heart that is unencumbered by the past and that lives currently in the passing of time and the fragility of being alive. The contrite, broken heart can be filled only by what is promised in the future. This is the paradox of Advent. In the middle of the wilderness, God works the impossible in those whose hearts are ready for the surprise of hope.

#### REFLECTION FOR ADULTS AND ADOLESCENTS

#### **Questions for Adolescents**

- Why would John have gone out into the wilderness to conduct his ministry?
- What do you think people found attractive about John's baptism of forgiveness?
- Why is the first sentence of the passage significant, given it is the very first sentence of the gospel of Mark?
- What would followers of John have thought about his prediction of someone coming after him?
- How can we continue to prepare the way for the Lord?

- Can you recall a time when you have had to consciously prepare yourself for what you were about to do?
- Why is the wilderness an appropriate image for preparation?
- Why does the gospel writer go to such lengths to associate John with the prophecies of history?
- How does this gospel passage relate to the Advent season?
- How can we continue to prepare the way for the Lord?

This is an opportunity for parents to discuss today's Gospel with your children. The following questions and worksheet are a beginning point to assist with the discussion.

- Who is the prophet in today's Gospel who spent time in the desert?
- What did he do?
- John the Baptist told people they must be sorry for the things they had done wrong so they could be ready to meet Jesus.
- What things do we need to be sorry for?
- How can we change our ways so that we can be ready to meet Jesus?
