Israel believed that the temple was built over the navel of the universe, the axis mundi, that spot where the world above and the world below met the world of his-



tory, thus enabling the three worlds to communicate. When Jesus called himself the new temple, he was claiming to be the centre of the universe, the spot where three-way cosmic communication occurs, the presence of God in the midst of the community. When we accept him in faith, we are accepting these claims. We may profess this belief, but do our lives reflect it?

Although some consider the law a rigid set of precepts, it is really more a collection of directives that have grown out of the experience of life. To say that Jesus is the wisdom of God means that God's wisdom is made known in him and that he is the way that points to God. While laws often embody distinctive cultural values or customs, as wisdom of God, Jesus crosses cultural boundaries and breaks down cultural distinctions.

As the wisdom of God, Jesus fulfils the expectations of any and all codes of law.

Both the law and the temple witness to the power of God in the lives of believers. However, both institutions pale in the light of Jesus who is identified as the power of God. This divine power is not revealed in lofty precepts or in magnificent stones, but rather in the broken and pierced body of Jesus Christ. How willing are we to accept him?

Dear Friends,

It is believed that every person has a 'predominant fault' and anger is the most predominant in the present day society. A study from 2019 examined 30,000 twitter posts by celebrities to determine the key to increasing user engagement. It was predicted that anger in particular predicts greater impact: it results in more retweets and replies and also increases in the number of new followers.

In the gospel this Sunday, we find Jesus expressing His righteous anger. It appears that there is a difference between expressing one's anger and committing a sin out of anger. Unlike most angry people, He experienced righteous anger, yet he did not sin. St. Paul clarifies it as follows: "be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and give no opportunity to the devil" (Eph. 4:26-27). Whether justified or not, anger turns destructive the longer we hold onto it. In the short term, those who expressed their righteous anger on social media felt good. However, the disadvantage of being a regular rager is that our anger grows with each episode, which makes us act in more dangerous ways.

Even while anger can be justified sometimes, St Paul advises us against staying constantly enraged. "Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamour and slander be put away from you, with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you" (Eph. 4:31-32). He continues in the Letter to Ephesians: "Whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (Phil. 4:8).

No one can escape feeling angry. However, how one expresses their rage indicates whether or not they have sinned. During this Lent, let us steer clear of staying enraged and not give a chance to the evil one. Let us be slow to anger and quick to forgive.
